Sr. Lucy Marie, S.V., is in her fifth year in the Family Life Office, and she is beginning her third year as **Respect Life Coordinator** for the Archdiocese. Prior to this position she had been serving pregnant women in need in the Sisters of Life Visitation Mission. As a founding member of the community, she has served in various additional capacities: formation, retreat works for the community, full time evangelization, and post-abortion healing. She is a native New Yorker, having grown up in Westchester County (St. Gregory the Great parish, in Harrison, NY) though she was originally born in Italy. Her great joy in religious life is in being able to place herself at the disposal of God and letting Him do as He wills – and that has taken her on many wonderful adventures of faith and love.



Sr. Margaret Ruth Mary, S.V., became **Assistant Respect Life Coordinator** in September, 2009. Before assuming that mission, she was at the Holy Respite convent on the west side of Manhattan for eight years, serving vulnerable pregnant women. She previously spent a year at the Shrine for the Unborn at the Church of the Holy Innocents, responding to those who have lost children through miscarriage, stillbirth, SIDS and abortion, and prior to that she served as Vocation Director for five years. As a founding member of the Sisters of Life, she has additionally served in post-abortion healing retreats and other retreat works for the community, part-time evangelization, and as assistant to the General Superior. Before entering religious life, she was a dietetic technician in several hospitals, a food chain home economist, and a consumer response specialist at a major food corporation. It was Eucharistic adoration, traveling abroad, and prayers of family that predisposed Sr. Margaret to respond to the call to religious life, particularly to uphold the sacredness of every human life.

The **Respect Life Program**:

- Coordinates parish, regional, and diocesan-wide activities in each of four major areas of the Bishops' Pastoral Plan on Pro-Life Activities:
 1. Educational and Informational resources, and events & conferences
 2. Pastoral Care to those in need of assistance with pregnancy or who have been affected by abortion
 3. Public Policy updates and legislative action alerts
 4. Prayer and Worship

- Encourages the formation and development of **Parish-based Respect Life Committees**:
 - To facilitate the establishment and continuing growth of individual respect life programs in each parish. Programs are developed by a core group assigned by, and under the guidance and authority of, the pastor. Currently we have approximately 200 lay parish respect life coordinators and 80 priest respect life coordinators.

Our office provides training where needed or requested, and offers ongoing, up-to-date support, resources, and ideas for promoting a culture of life within the parish community.

Marriage Preparation



Christopher Mueller, a happily married father of three, has been the **Coordinator of Marriage Preparation** since he joined the office staff in 2005. He and his wife, Constanza, teach “Part Two” of the Partners in Life and Love marriage preparation courses. In his role as Coordinator, he schedules these classes, works with presenters and facilities, and keeps all the course listings up-to-date on the website. He also does some work for the office in graphic design, general computer troubleshooting, and occasional musical assistance (since he also works as organist and choirmaster at a parish in Manhattan).



Lisa Dunleavy-Jennings joined the office staff in 1998 as **Assistant Coordinator of Marriage Preparation**. She and Kevin Jennings, her husband of 26 years, teach “Part One” marriage preparation classes (full days and evening sessions) throughout the Archdiocese. She works to recruit & train new teaching couples, and she handles all the “Part One” and Four-Evening schedules each year, working with presenters and sites to make sure that all logistics are met. Most of all, she strives to ensure that the engaged couples are given a very positive experience—so that they will choose to continue attending church, or perhaps even open up to the possibility of coming back to the Church.



Betty Loia joined the Family Life Office in October, 2008, as the most recent **Assistant Coordinator of Marriage Preparation**. She and her husband of 17 years, Robert, have taught marriage preparation for the Archdiocese of Baltimore and the Diocese of Paterson, NJ, for more than a decade, and they now teach “Part Two” courses here in New York. She also recruits and trains other teaching couples for the “Part Two” marriage preparation program. Additionally, Betty works with Katia Peacher Gutiérrez as a Creighton Method NFP instructor, and she does event planning for the Family Life Office, such as the Golden Jubilee Mass.

Marriage Preparation

The Marriage Preparation program of the Archdiocese of New York is designed to introduce couples to the beauty of the Church's teachings on the Sacrament of Marriage and to assist couples in developing relationship skills that will set the foundation for a life-long, joy-filled marriage.

Our Archdiocesan *Partners in Life and Love* marriage preparation program consists of two full-day courses or four evening sessions.

1. "Part One" covers skills important to relationships, such as communication, dealing with in-laws, and talking about parenting and finances.
2. "Part Two" gives a thorough grounding in church teaching, including a thorough exposition of the wedding vows, an in-depth look at sexuality and the culture, and the reality of love as a vehicle of God's action in the world.
3. Part One or Part Two can be taken first—we do not require a particular sequence.
4. In 2009, **nearly 2500 couples** participated in the Two-Day course.
5. The course is also available in a four-evening format, where the Part One and Part Two topics are evenly distributed among the four sessions. In 2008, **nearly 750 couples** participated in the Four-Evening course.
6. Additionally, bimonthly newsletters on marriage and pro-life events are emailed to **nearly 14,000** past and present marriage preparation registrants.

We offer classes year-round, throughout the Archdiocese. Please see our scheduling booklet, *Preparation Programs for the Sacrament of Marriage*, for additional details, and dates and locations of classes. Couples are encouraged to register for our courses online, at <http://flrl.org/>

Marriage Enrichment



Nancy A. Rizzi has worked in the Family Life Office for 14 years—four years as Respect Life Coordinator, and 10 years in her current position as **Coordinator of Marriage Enrichment**. She has developed a one-day “Celebrate Marriage” program that is presented throughout the Archdiocese in parishes and retreat centers (which is also available in Spanish—see pp. 20-21). This one-day program can also be presented over the course of a few evening or afternoon sessions, depending upon the needs of the parish.

- The goal of “Celebrate Marriage” is to revitalize Christian marriages and help couples recapture their joy, intimacy and spirituality. The day provides married couples “quality time” free of distraction, to work together through the blessings and challenges of marriage. With society’s pressures and the demands on families, the “Celebrate Marriage” program is critical in providing hope, healing, support and guidance to married couples.
- The day consists of presentations based on all aspects of marriage: from enhancing communication and listening skills to the gift of marital sexuality and living the Sacrament of Marriage in today’s world. A renewal of wedding vows takes place at the end of the day; evenings and afternoon sessions are also offered.
- **236 couples** participated in “Celebrate Marriage” days in 2009.
- Nancy and her husband, Jim, have over 25 years’ experience conducting Catholic workshops and seminars on marriage and family and have assisted four other dioceses in implementing the Celebrate Marriage enrichment days.
- They also present Worldwide Marriage Encounter weekends in the Archdiocese and have a trained team of couples and priests working in the program. **180 couples** participated in Marriage Encounter weekends in the Archdiocese in 2009.
- **150 couples** attended free parish movie/date night events held at parishes in 2009.
- Both the one-day and weekend enrichment programs are beneficial to couples of all ages and years married.

After completing her Master's from the John Paul II Institute, she joined the Family Life Office in 2007 as the Spanish Programs Coordinator. Last year she transitioned into the bilingual **Natural Family Planning (NFP) Coordinator** (English and Spanish).

Katia coordinates the schedules of teachers and sites for all four methods of NFP offered throughout the Archdiocese (Billings, Couple to Couple League, Creighton, Archdiocesan Sympto-thermal); organizes and promotes seminars for priests and laity on NFP and NaProTechnology; recruits others to become trained NFP teachers. Additionally, she is a teacher of the Creighton Model System (CrMS) in English and Spanish offering courses at the Family Life Office.

The NFP apostolate is dedicated to helping men and women live in harmony with God's plan for life and love, while strengthening marriages and families.

1. Introductory classes in NFP are available in English or Spanish. These classes are available year-round in many locations throughout the Archdiocese.
2. These courses give healthy, ethical alternatives to couples struggling with infertility.
3. **Over 650 people attended an NFP course in 2009.**

Chastity Education



Kimberly Burdette is the newest member of the Family Life/Respect Life Office staff family. She obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Early Childhood Education from James Madison University and a Masters Degree from Towson University in Elementary Education. With her strong educational background, extensive presentation skills, and love for her Catholic faith, she

looks forward to bringing enthusiasm, creativity and a passion for chastity education to the Archdiocese of New York.

As **Coordinator of Chastity Education**, she will implement a program new to the Family Life/Respect Life Office in the 2009-2010 year, to formally promote the Catholic teaching of God's gift of human sexuality.

Through our Chastity Education program we hope to:

- provide a fuller awareness of God's plan for sexuality
- focus and increase vocations to the priesthood, to consecrated religious life, and to marriage (which has been dwindling in recent years).
- reduce /eliminate the occurrence of pre-marital sexual relations, unplanned pregnancies, and sexually transmitted disease

The program will include:

1. Providing resources to those facilitating the Human Sexuality component of the 7th and 8th grade Catechesis curriculum.
2. Chastity talks (complete with visuals and interactive elements) to Catholic schools, catechetical programs, parishes, youth groups, and young adult groups.
3. Establishing a Chastity Speakers Bureau, so that chastity talks may be provided throughout the Archdiocese.
4. Chastity Facilitator training for those interested in implementing a chastity education program in their area.
5. Promoting educational events and retreats for ongoing chastity awareness throughout the Archdiocese.

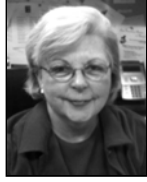

Eileen Murphy, a former Catholic school teacher and Catechist, has been teaching Parenting workshops for almost three decades, having started the first parish-based Education for Parenting Center in the Archdiocese in the early 1980's. Eileen came onto the Family Life Office staff in 1987, as one of four itinerant Regional

Associate Directors, starting up Parenting Centers, making presentations, and conducting workshops. She continues that work today as **Coordinator of Education for Parenting programs**, traveling throughout the Archdiocese. She also offers Leadership Training in Education for Parenting for parish leaders, for which she writes programs, provides support, troubleshoots, and coordinates the work of the Parenting Center directors.

The mission of Education for Parenting is to articulate the sacredness of our parental vocation to raise children to be spiritually, morally, emotionally, socially, intellectually, and physically healthy, responsible Catholics with strong faith. Using presentations, workshops, parish **Parenting Center weekly meetings** focused on parents with infants, toddlers and preschoolers, and Training Extension Network meetings for leaders, we

1. disseminate age-appropriate behavior and developmental information for each growth level from birth throughout the young adult years,
2. teach parents user-friendly non-violent discipline skills, and the family relationship skills of communication and conflict resolution,
3. create support networks in the parish community to encourage parents and support parenting leaders throughout the far-flung areas of the Archdiocese.

These activities allow us the opportunity to evangelize and provide on-the-job spiritual nurturing for families raising children, the current and future followers of Christ and members/leaders of our Church. **There are 33 Parish-based Parenting Centers.**

Bereavement



Christina Schuerger, L.C.S.W., born and raised on Long Island, New York, joined the Family Life Office in April of 2009. She received her undergraduate degree with a major in Social Work at the Franciscan University of Steubenville and went on to receive her Master's Degree at Hunter College School of Social Work in 2003. Christina has previously worked in foster care and outpatient mental health providing social work and counseling services to the community and is bi-lingual. She additionally has a private practice providing Catholic counseling to individuals, couples and their families.

1. The role of the Pastoral Bereavement Facilitator is to bring those who are suffering closer to Our Lord through prayer and parish based **bereavement support groups**. Many of our volunteers have been called to this work through their own experiences of loss and have been inspired by the Holy Spirit to give of themselves in this area, in service to the Church.
2. **There are 51 such parish based bereavement support groups** throughout the Archdiocese.
3. Additionally, the Bereavement program offers training and support for new leaders of these support groups. The next training session, for all those interested in starting a bereavement group in their parish, will be held on Tuesdays, November 10 & 17 from 6:00-8:30 p.m., at St. Jean Baptiste parish in Manhattan (located at East 76th St. and Lexington Ave.).
4. There is also considerable Post-Abortion outreach, including Project Rachel, and work with the Sisters of Life and their *Hope and Healing After Abortion* retreats. The **Bereavement Coordinator** connects priests, laity, clinicians and post-abortive men and women to the proper referral service (*e.g.* individual counseling, trained Project Rachel priests, and/or support groups and weekend retreats).

Outreach to the Separated & Divorced



Carmen Noschese, M.S. M.F.T., joined the staff of the Family Life Office in 2006 as the **Coordinator of Outreach to the Separated & Divorced**. She instructs volunteers to the ministry who then become facilitators of parish-based support groups.

They are shown the love of Christ so as to communicate that to others. It's the desire of those involved to assist individuals suffering the traumatic experience of separation and/or divorce in a haven of support and non-judgment. The individuals who take part have the opportunity to receive emotional support within a safe environment in which to overcome their crisis. In addition to her work with those afflicted by divorce or separation, she has extensive experience working with individuals, families, and groups as a therapist in private practice.

Many individuals experience a profoundly deep isolation as they go through the stress of a separation or divorce. They may become overwhelmed by feelings of not belonging, or of being cut off from God, the church, and their family.

The Archdiocesan Outreach to the Separated and Divorced provides understanding and a caring presence during this time, through ongoing parish-based bimonthly support groups. We offer information and education on a number of topics, including

1. the grieving process
2. coping skills
3. Church teaching on annulments

There are 13 such support groups in the Archdiocese.

Outreach to Young Adults

Patrick Langrell is the Coordinator of Young Adult Outreach.

Originally from Sydney, Australia, Patrick graduated from The University of Notre Dame (Australia) in 2009 with a degree in Philosophy and a minor in Theology. He recently moved to New York to serve the young adult community. Prior to his work in New York, Patrick worked extensively with the young adult community in the Archdiocese of Sydney, organizing a variety of events and initiatives. Our mission in this is to promote the Gospel of Life by defending human life at all stages, and promoting and strengthening marriage and family life.
- We work closely with the statewide Catholic Advocacy Network, a program of the New York State Catholic Conference, which organizes and mobilizes grassroots email advocacy in support of the positions of the Church on public policy matters.
- We also participate in initiatives from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Pro-Life Secretariat, the National Committee for a Human Life Amendment, and other pro-life, pro-family advocates.

Denise D'Oleo was born in the Dominican Republic and has been married for 15 years. She is a Family and Couple Therapist. She became the **Spanish Programs Coordinator** for the second time in 2008, having held the position previously in 2003-2004. (Her initial tenure was interrupted by a four-year return to the Dominican Republic.) She oversees the following programs in

Spanish:

- **Marriage Preparation (Pre-Cana)** is a two-day program. "Part One" focuses on the call to the Sacrament of Marriage, self-knowledge, communication skills, conflict resolution, decision-making, sexuality, and family spirituality. "Part Two" covers the Sacramental nature of Marriage; we explain the significance of the questions of consent, and the Moral teaching of the Church regarding Natural Family Planning and other themes. The Spanish Pre-Cana program is running in 13 parishes. We are looking forward to working more closely with pastors to update the program, as well as developing a program to encourage couples to seek to convalidate their civil marriage. We are also in the process of recruiting and training new presenting couples. **Over 300 couples** attended marriage preparation in Spanish in fiscal year 2008.
- The goal of **Marriage Enrichment** is to offer to Hispanic couples concrete guidance and support to live a committed, faith-filled marriage. The one-day workshop is very beneficial to couples of all ages and years married. The enrichment day focuses on communication, spirituality, sexuality and practical insights to living a joy-filled marriage in today's world. **60 couples participated** in marriage enrichment in Spanish in 2009.
- Since 2006 we have offered a **Pro-Life Congress** to educate Hispanic Catholics on pro-life and pro-family topics. The 2009 Congress will be held on Saturday, October 24th, at Cardinal Hayes Auditorium, in the Bronx, and upstate on Sunday, October 25th, at the Graymoor Spiritual Life Center.
- Additionally, **we offer assistance and materials in Spanish for the other programs of the Family Life Office:** Bereavement, Project Rachel, Outreach to the Separated and Divorced, Education for Parenting, and Respect Life.

Denise D'Oleo nació en la República Dominicana y ha estado casada por 15 años. Es Psicóloga Clínica, con especialidad en Terapia de Familia y Pareja. Comenzó a trabajar como **Coordinadora de los Programas en Español** por segunda vez en el 2008. Estuvo desempeñando previamente esta posición del 2003 al 2004. (Su primer período fue interrumpido por cuatro años al retornar a su país de origen). Está encargada de los siguientes programas en Español:

- **Preparación Matrimonial (Pre-Cana)** Es un programa que se imparte en dos días. La primera parte se enfoca en el llamado al Sacramento del Matrimonio, conocimiento personal, destrezas de comunicación, resolución de conflictos, toma de decisiones, sexualidad y espiritualidad en la familia. El contenido del segundo día está basado en la parte Teológica del Sacramento del Matrimonio y allí exploramos las razones que mueven a las parejas a casarse por la Iglesia Católica. Hablamos sobre la importancia de los votos de consentimiento, así como de la Enseñanza Moral de la Iglesia en temas relacionados con la Planificación Natural de la familia, entre otros. Nuestro Programa Arquidiocesano está funcionando en 13 parroquias. En este momento nuestro esfuerzo está canalizado en trabajar más de cerca con los párrocos para fortalecer el programa, así como en el desarrollo de otros programas dirigidos a parejas que buscan convalidar su matrimonio civil. También estamos en el proceso de entrenar más parejas presentadoras.
- **Enriquecimiento Matrimonial** La meta de este programa es ofrecer a las parejas hispanas, guía y apoyo práctico para vivir un compromiso matrimonial basado en la Fe. El taller es muy beneficioso para parejas de todas las edades y tiempo de casados, ya sea su matrimonio civil o por la Iglesia. El Enriquecimiento Matrimonial se enfoca en temas como: Comunicación, Espiritualidad, Sexualidad e ideas prácticas para vivir un matrimonio lleno de alegría en el mundo actual. 60 parejas participaron en los cursos de Enriquecimiento Matrimonial en el 2009.
- **Congreso Pro-Vida** Desde el 2006 hemos ofrecido a la población Hispana un Congreso con temas Pro-Vida y Pro-familia, para educar a nuestra gente sobre temas como: Síndrome Post-Aborto, Castidad, Políticas Públicas y los Beneficios de la PNF para la vida matrimonial, entre otros. Este año el IV Congreso será el 24 de octubre en el Cardinal Hayes (Bronx) y el 25 en el Convento Franciscano de Graymoor. Para el próximo año vamos a organizar además un Segundo Congreso, específicamente dirigido a parejas, cuyo objetivo es fortalecer esta relación primaria, base de la vida familiar.
- Adicionalmente, **ofrecemos asistencia y materiales en Español para otros programas de la Oficina de Vida de Familia:** Duelo, Proyecto Raquel, Ministerio de Separados y Divorciados, Educación para padres y Respeto a la Vida.
